Though Ministry in Mission is still providing support to our brothers and sisters in Jacmel we find it more difficult each month and have had to cut back on some distribution of funds.

A very urgent need for medical care for Ministry in Mission Board member, Junior Vlad Laurent is a priority. In his own words:

serious accident while riding my motorcycle. As I was on my motorcycle an armored SWAT truck unexpectedly swerved into my lane and struck me. The injuries I sustained are very severe. I had two surgeries on my broken left arm. An open wound required stitches on my upper left eye. Surgery took place on December 7, 2024 to attempt to repair a broken knee and femur on my left leg.

Although my first two surgeries took place on December 7th, and December 13th, 2024, I have yet to undergo additional surgery on my femur. The femur and knee surgery is crucial for my recovery to be able to walk again.

I am seeking assistance for transportation and medical care. There are no orthopedic surgeons that can perform this difficult surgery in Haiti, therefore transportation is necessary to operate on this injury. I would greatly appreciate your financial assistance, support and prayers.
